Dog Safety Policy

By bringing your pet to campus as part of the NCSU Free Moms on-campus experience, you agree to comply with this *Dog Safety Policy* in its entirety.

NCSU Free Moms offers pet visits during the on-campus experience. The volunteers who share their dogs are first on-boarded through a process which includes participation in a one-on-one pet safety protocol conversation before their first visit to campus with NCSU Free Moms. The NCSU Free Moms Dog Coordinator Volunteer discusses the safety protocols with the prospective visitor during a phone call made prior to an on-campus visit. After the call, the Dog Coordinator sends a text to the pet owner confirming the important elements of the dog safety protocol and their conversation.

All Pet Owners must agree to comply with the terms of this Dog Safety Policy in order to bring their pet to campus and participate with the NCSU Free Moms on-campus experience.

The Pet Owners agree to the following before they are permitted to visit students during an NCSU Free Moms on-campus experience:

- The Pet Owner is solely responsible and solely liable for the behavior of their dog.
- The Pet Owner certifies that their dog is up-to-date and compliant with the applicable North Carolina vaccine schedule.
- The Pet Owner understands that their dog must be socialized and comfortable in situations involving crowds, strangers approaching and petting them, other dogs nearby, bicyclers and skateboarding in the vicinity. This is a public space, and NCSU Free Moms cannot control the presence of unaffiliated people and/or animals.
- No foster dogs are permitted to attend an NCSU Free Moms on-campus experience.
- The Pet Owner may only bring one dog from their family per visit. No other dogs from the same family may visit at the same time.
- The Pet Owner certifies that their dog shall remain on leash at all times during the visit.
- The Pet Owner understands that they must ensure that their dog stays a minimum of five (5) feet away from any other dog at all times. Upon arrival or departure, and only if no students are in close proximity, Pet Owners may allow their dogs to do a quick greet if both owners are in agreement.
- The Pet Owner understands that they must keep their dog at least fifteen (15) feet from any food table, and they should keep their dog at least ten (10) feet from where the lines of students typically form. Pet Owners are asked to keep their dogs aware from spaces where students are sitting and eating or studying.
